

# Edgenuity Student Agreement

As a student who utilizes Edgenuity for Virtual Learning, I attest that I will abide by the following practices:

- Regular attendance is required. Students who do not attend the program regularly will be dropped to make room for other students.
- While using Edgenuity, students may not access the internet through other windows on the computer or through any other electronic device. Violation of this agreement will constitute a violation of the school's Responsible Use Policy and may result in students losing all computer privileges.
- I understand that grading practices and weights for all courses will remain as those defaults originally used by the district. The grading weights for virtual learners will remain the same as those for other learners.
- Students may take notes when they are completing each lesson. Students may use only the notes they take to help them on quizzes.
- Once a student is assigned a course, there will be no questions/lessons skipped, unless the student is attempting credit recovery (CRX). In the case of credit recovery, only those questions/lessons will be skipped that are automatically noted by the pretest results.
- If a student begins a course in mid-term, the number of lessons for a particular course will be determined by calculating the percentage of time a student will spend in the course and assigning Edgenuity lessons accordingly. For example, if a student will spend the entire semester on Virtual Learning, then he/she should complete the entire semester long course. If a student is to spend 6 weeks on Virtual Learning, then he/she should complete 33% of the course. Selection of specific lessons to comprise the appropriate percentage will be determined by the Edgenuity instructor after consultation with the classroom teacher.
- The district has set the maximum number of attempts for Edgenuity assignments at two (2). These protocols will remain constant for all students and courses and will not be overridden. There will be no resets for students to have attempts beyond the numbers set forth above.
- A passing score for student lessons, quizzes, and tests is set at 70%. Students scoring below 70% on the first attempt must retake the assignment to improve the score. If a student scores above 70% of his/her first attempt, then no more attempts are allowed. If a

student must attempt an assignment more than one time, then the last score is always the one that will be counted, regardless of which score is higher.

- Student overall grades for the course will be determined based upon the grading scale set by each individual school.
- All courses will include the completion of a semester or final test, unless a school has a policy that directs otherwise.
